The Hidden Cost of Constant Migrations

Data migrations are meant to improve efficiency, yet many organisations find themselves stuck in a never-ending cycle of migration projects. Whether it's replatforming, upgrading, or moving to the latest vendor solution, these migrations demand time, resources, and attention, pulling teams away from delivering real business value.

At what point does migration stop being a solution and become the problem? Why Do Migrations Keep Happening?

For many organisations, migration projects never really end. Whether it's switching ETL vendors, upgrading platforms, or responding to vendordriven pricing changes, businesses feel like they are always in transition.



Are migrations solving problems or just patching the past?

Many migrations happen reactively, **a contract is expiring**, **a vendor increases prices, or a system is outdated**, but these projects don't always align with business goals.



How much productivity is lost?

Teams spend **months firefighting migration issues instead of delivering insights.** The cost isn't just in budget, it's in lost time, focus, and strategic momentum.



Are vendors making it harder?

Some ETL providers push **complex migration processes that create new dependencies,** locking businesses into a **cycle of continuous migration.**

Migrations should be a business decision, not just an IT project


Too many data teams migrate without clear business drivers. Whether it's responding to vendor changes or adopting the latest technology, migrations often happen for technical reasons rather than business impact.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Align migration projects with business priorities and ROI. If a migration isn't directly improving performance, cost-efficiency, or scalability, reconsider if it's needed.
- Assess migration risks before committing. Understand the impact on teams, resources, and operational costs.
- Plan migrations around business cycles, not just IT schedules. Avoid high-risk migration periods that disrupt operations.

"If you can't forecast real benefits from a migration, whether that's performance, cost reduction, or business agility, it's probably not worth doing." Kyle Probert





2 Understand the hidden productivity costs of migration

Migrations don't just cost money, they drain time, resources, and focus. Every migration diverts attention from delivering insights, improving customer experience, and driving innovation.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- On't assume teams can handle migrations alongside business-asusual. Many projects fail because teams are overloaded with both migration work and daily operations.
- Use automation where possible. Manual migrations increase error rates and slow teams down.
- Outsource migration workload strategically. Bringing in experts can accelerate timelines and prevent unnecessary delays.

"Trying to migrate while maintaining full business-as-usual operations is a recipe for failure. Plan for extra capacity or risk burning out your team." Aaron Phethean





3 Avoid vendor lock-in and costly renewal traps

Many migrations are driven by vendor pricing changes rather than business needs. ETL vendors often lock businesses into proprietary models that make switching expensive and complex.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Before renewing contracts, evaluate alternative solutions. Many businesses auto-renew ETL contracts without considering better pricing models.
- Look for vendors that support open standards and interoperability.
 Avoid platforms that make data migration harder than it needs to be.
- Negotiate pricing before you're locked into a renewal. Vendors rarely offer their best pricing upfront pushing for competitive offers can result in significant savings.

"Too many companies migrate because they feel forced to, whether it's an expiring contract or a sudden price hike. Strategic leaders negotiate first and migrate only when necessary." Richard Shenghua





4 Reduce migration risks through iterative change

One of the biggest fears in migration is breaking critical operations. Too many teams try to move everything at once, leading to extended downtime, broken pipelines, and reporting failures.

KEY TAKEAWAYS

- Series And Antice States and Series And Antice Series And Antice Series And Antice Series Antice Ser
- Lift-and-shift first, modernise later. This approach minimises downtime while allowing for future optimisation.
- Validate migration steps with POCs (proof-of-concept) before full rollout. Small-scale testing reduces risk and builds confidence.

"Successful teams don't see migration as an all-or-nothing move. They iterate, test, and adapt instead of taking a bigbang approach." Kyle Probert



Making Migrations a Seamless, Business-as-Usual Process

Migrations don't have to be disruptive. The best teams treat migration as an ongoing process, not a painful one-off event.

- Embed migration readiness into operational planning. Don't wait for an emergency, build migration frameworks into your technology strategy.
- Continuously evaluate vendors and platforms. Keep options open to avoid last-minute, high-pressure migrations.
- Prioritise automation and standardisation. The more you automate; the easier migration becomes.
